## Child Care Breastfeeding Policy (Sample; adapted from North Carolina's policy for centers)

Because I am committed to healthy mothers and children, My Child Care Program Supports Breastfeeding

In order to support families who are breastfeeding or who are considering breastfeeding, I strive to do the following:

- Make a commitment to the importance of breastfeeding, especially exclusive breastfeeding, and proudly share this commitment with current and prospective families.
- Train any helpers or substitutes in best practices for feeding infants and young children.
- Inform families about the importance of breastfeeding.
- Develop a breastfeeding-friendly feeding plan with each family.
- Learn best practices for handling, storing, and feeding mother's milk.
- Teach parents to properly store and label their milk for use at child care.
- Provide a breastfeeding-friendly environment, welcoming mothers to nurse their babies in my program.
- Display posters and brochures that support breastfeeding and show best practices.
- Contact and coordinate with local sources of skilled breastfeeding support and actively refer parents.
- Continually update my information and learning about breastfeeding support.
